### Permitting Legislation

- Designate and prioritize projects of strategic national importance.
- Set maximum timelines for permitting reviews, including two years for NEPA reviews for major projects and one year for lower-impact projects.
- Improve Section 401 of the Clean Water Act by incorporating improvements from both the Trump and Biden administrations.
- Address excessive litigation delays.
- Clarify FERC jurisdiction regarding the regulation of interstate hydrogen pipeline, storage, import, and export facilities.
- Enhance federal government permitting authority for interstate electric transmission facilities that have been determined by the Secretary of Energy to be in the national interest.
- Complete the Mountain Valley Pipeline.






# The Reliability of the Bulk Electric System requires Natural Gas








An Assessment of 2021

Performance


#### 2021 Long-Term Reliability Assessment





# Supreme Court reigns in federal agencies - West Virginia v. EPA:

Court called agency overreach a "particular and recurring problem."

"Major Questions" Test:

Did Congress "in fact mean[] to confer the power the agency has asserted"?

Agency must "point to clear congressional authorization" for action.

Novel applications of law that implicate important policy questions or have significant effects warrant skepticism.

"Modest words," "vague terms," and "subtle devices" not enough.



# Not a Silver Bullet: West Virginia v. EPA might not deter FERC and SEC

Decision strengthens arguments that aspects of FERC's and SEC's proposals exceed their authority (e.g., mitigation of indirect GHGs).

Agencies "discover[ed] in a long extant statute an unheralded power representing a transformative expansion in... authority."

"Public interest" and "protecting investors" are "vague statutory grant[s]... not close to the sort of clear authorization required."

There are "many vital considerations of national policy implicated in deciding how Americans will get their energy."

Because legal challenges will take years to resolve, FERC and SEC might move forward without changes despite the legal risks.



### In Summary:

- Look for Permitting Reform to continue as a topic of discussion in Washington, DC
  - Follow what is being proposed in Congress
  - Reach out to your Senator or Representative to ask for their support!
- Natural gas is integral to ensuring reliability of our Bulk Electric Power system:
  - > Current reliability assessments call for natural gas
  - There is realistic solution for a reliable & affordable transition to a lower carbon economy without natural gas
  - Monitor the developing European energy crisis
- Look for additional actions related to the "Major Question" doctrine related to Federal Agency actions
